

### Dear Friends,

It is our pleasure to bring you this Annual Report, which details many exciting things that Wings has accomplished during the past year. 2013 brought us new volunteers, new Board members, and new funders, as well as 584 women who received our help and support as they embarked on their journeys to employment and self-sufficiency.

We are delighted to share that we have completed the requirements for *Tier One Standards for Excellence* from the *Pennsylvania Association of Nonprofit Organizations (PANO)*. This application process helped us to ensure that Wings is observing best practices in our financial, governance, and operational procedures.

2013 was a year of celebration for Wings, as we marked our 15th anniversary and honored all of the leaders and funders who have helped Wings serve more than 8,000

women since our start. At our annual *Merriment, Makeovers and Miracles* fundraising event, we had the opportunity to hear three recent clients share their stories of the impact Wings has had on their lives. We also had the opportunity to honor Carol Larkin, one of Wings' key, longtime volunteers.

It was also a year of firsts, including our first evaluation of Wings programs' long-term impact on clients (see inside for further details), and our first-ever Wings Flash Sale, to generate revenue from excess inventory of apparel. We are especially heartened by what we have learned from our clients. In July, we began following up with clients we have served, in order to determine where they were on their journey to employment when they first came to Wings, and where they were 3 to 6 months later. Of the clients we were able to reach, 62% had moved forward in their journey toward employment and self-sufficiency.

As we enter 2014, we have much to look forward to. Our Board will be developing a new strategic plan to guide our growth in the years to come. This spring, we pioneered Wings' first signature Fashion Show event! Our strong financial health positions us for significant growth in the years to come, and we remain extremely thankful for our extraordinary volunteers and for all those who support Wings year-round, with donations of clothing and funds. You are all helping to make a difference in the lives of women in this community!





# Wings for Success Mission, Goals & Vision

- Our mission is to improve the employment opportunities of disadvantaged women by providing work-appropriate attire, wardrobe guidance, and life skills workshops.
- Some Wings clients are survivors of homelessness, addiction, or domestic abuse. Some are returning to the workforce after many years of joblessness, while others are seeking their first job. Nearly all live in poverty and are working to build self-esteem and self-sufficiency. Wings' goal is to help these women on their journey by providing free professional clothing, knowledgeable and compassionate support, and the skills they will need to be successful in interviews and in the workplace.
- Our vision is a community in which all women have the support they need to become independent and take their place in a strong and growing economy.

# **Accomplishments**

- Wings assisted 584 women at clothing appointments, providing them with free work-appropriate clothing for interviews and new jobs, as well as support and confidence.
- Wings conducted 12 educational workshops attended by 162 women, on topics such as interviewing skills, appropriate workplace attire, and wearing the right attitude on the job.
- Our clients reported 99% satisfaction with the services they received at Wings, and 97% reported an increase in confidence by the end of their appointment.
- Three to six months after their Wings appointment, 62% of our clients had moved forward in their journey toward employment and self-sufficiency.
